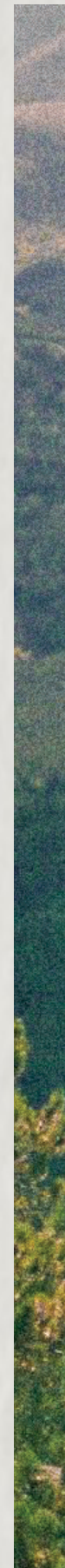

Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God...

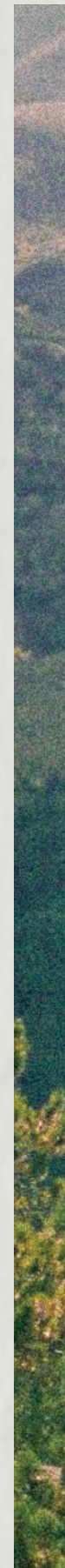

Mark 8:27-29 ^{NIV}

Jesus and his disciples went on to the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked them, **“Who do people say I am?”**
²⁸ They replied, “Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.” ²⁹ “But what about you?” he asked. **“Who do you say I am?”** Peter answered, “You are the Messiah.”

Moses

Called by God on Mount Horeb

Led Israel from Egypt to Canaan

Died on Mount Nebo and was buried by God

Deuteronomy 18:15 ^{NIV}

The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your fellow Israelites. **You must listen to him.**

Elijah

Prophet and Man of God, Miracle Worker

Proclaimed the Word of the Lord on Mount Carmel

Met with God on Mount Horeb

Taken into heaven in a whirlwind

Malachi 4:5-6 ^{NIV}

“See, I will send the prophet Elijah to you before that great and dreadful day of the LORD comes.

⁶ He will turn the hearts of the parents to their children, and the hearts of the children to their parents; or else I will come and strike the land with total destruction.”

Mark 9:4 ^{NIV}

And there appeared before them Elijah and Moses, who were talking with Jesus.

Luke 9:31 ^{NIV}

They spoke **about his departure (*exodos*)**, which he was about to bring to fulfillment at Jerusalem.



Proverbs 17:28 ^{NIV}

Even fools are thought wise if they keep silent, and discerning if they hold their tongues.



Mark 9:5-6 ^{NIV}

Peter said to Jesus, “Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.” ⁶ (He did not know what to say, they were so frightened.)



Mark 9:7 ^{NIV}

Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: “This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!”

Mark 1:11 ^{NIV}

And a voice came from heaven: “You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased.”



Mark 9:8 NIV

Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus.



Mark 9:9-10 ^{NIV}

As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until **the Son of Man had risen from the dead.**

¹⁰ They kept the matter to themselves, discussing what “rising from the dead” meant.



Mark 9:11-13 ^{NIV}

And they asked him, “Why do the teachers of the law say that Elijah must come first?” ¹² Jesus replied, “To be sure, Elijah does come first, and restores all things. Why then is it written that **the Son of Man must suffer much** and be rejected? ¹³ But I tell you, **Elijah has come**, and they have done to him everything they wished, just as it is written about him.”
