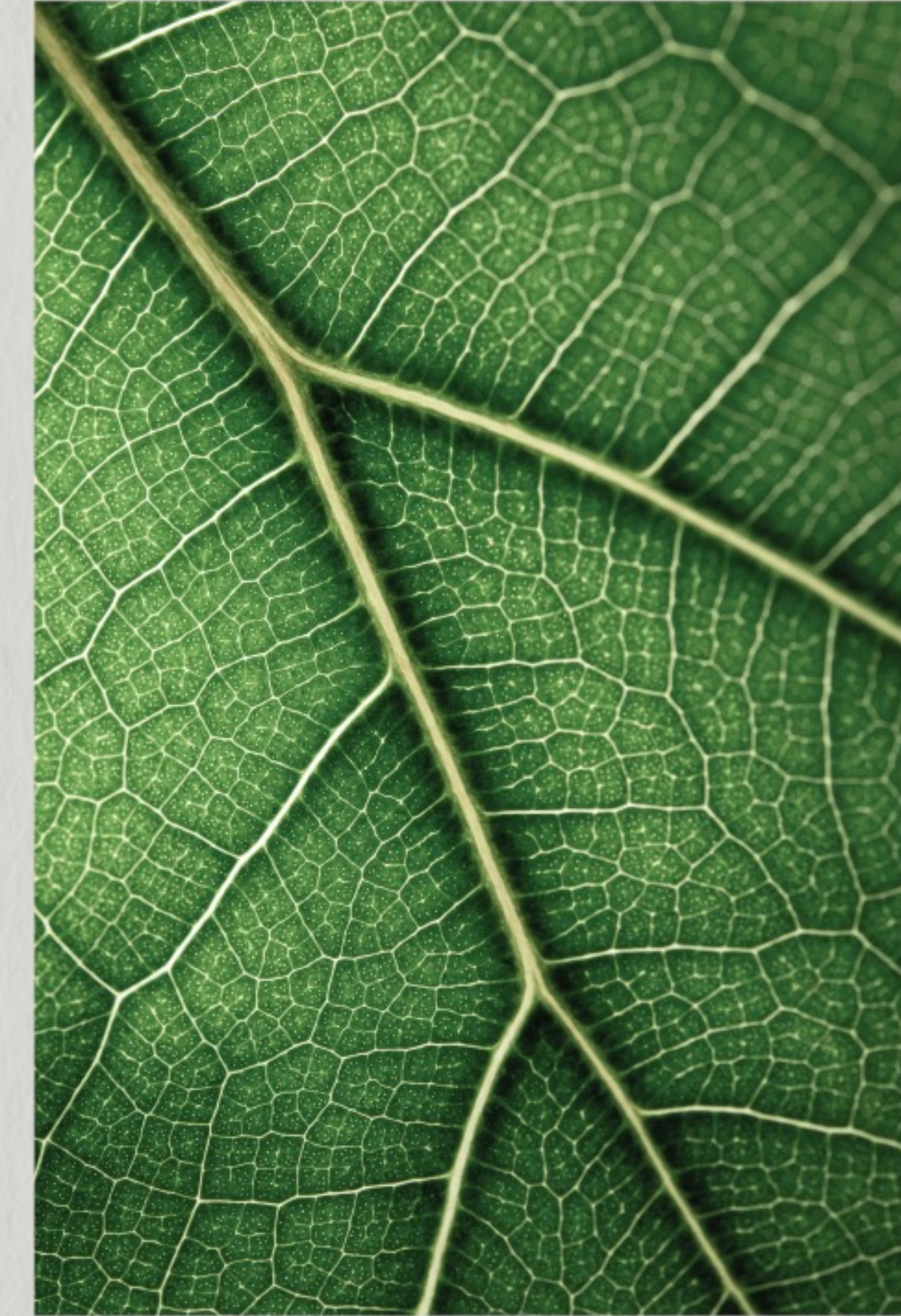

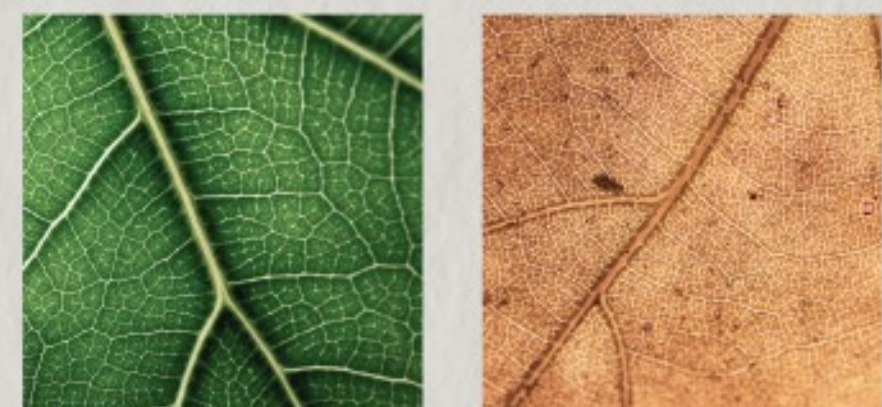


Mark's Sandwich

Story A' - Teaches on Barren Fig Tree (11:20-25)

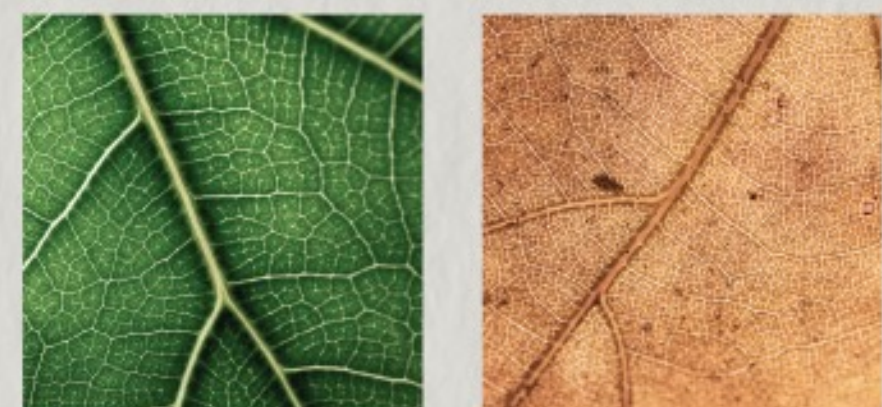




Story A

The next day as they were leaving Bethany, Jesus was hungry. ¹³ Seeing **in the distance** a fig tree **in leaf**, he went to find out if it had any fruit. When he reached it, he found **nothing but leaves**, because it was not the season for figs. ¹⁴ Then he said to the tree, “May no one ever eat fruit from you again.” And his disciples heard him say it.

Story B

On reaching Jerusalem, Jesus entered the temple area and began driving out those who were buying and selling there. He overturned the tables of the money changers and the benches of those selling doves,¹⁶ and would not allow anyone to carry merchandise through the temple courts.

And as he taught them, he said, “Is it not written: ‘My house will be called a **house of prayer for all nations**’? But you have made it 'a den of robbers.’” ¹⁸ The chief priests and the teachers of the law heard this and began looking for a way to kill him, for they feared him, because the whole crowd was amazed at his teaching.

Story B

“...to them I will give **within my temple** and its walls a memorial and a name better than sons and daughters; I will give them an everlasting name that will not be cut off. ⁶ And *foreigners* who bind themselves to the Lord to serve him, to love the name of the Lord, and to worship him... ⁷ these I will bring to my holy mountain and give them joy in my house of prayer. Their burnt offerings and sacrifices will be accepted on my altar; **for my house will be called a house of prayer for all nations.**”

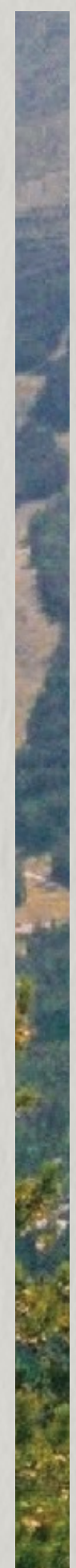

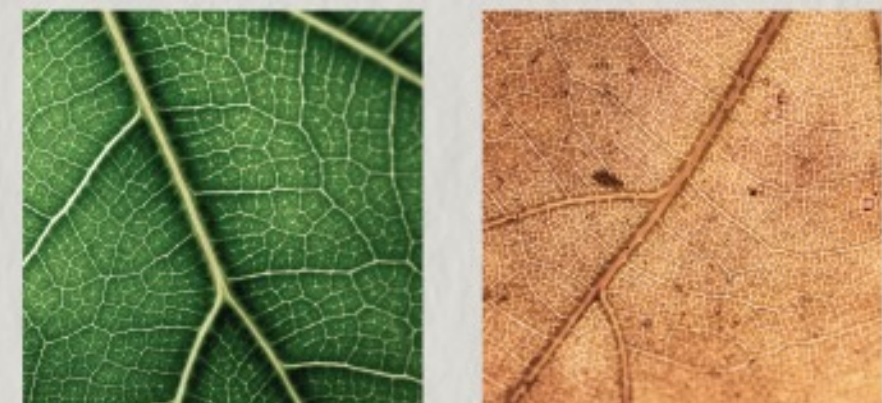


Opposite of Hypocrisy
